Submission

The manuscript should include an abstract written in English of not more than 250 words as well as between five and eight keywords, placed immediately after the abstract. Typically, the abstract should state the research problem, aim, methods, main findings, implications, conclusion and major recommendations of the study. Manuscript should be typed doublespaced, fully justified, in Times New Roman and Font Size 12 on A4 paper as a Word document. manuscript size should be between 5,000 and 8,000 words (including abstract, keywords, notes, references, etc.). The documentation style adopted by the Journal for all manuscripts is the American Psychological Association (APA) 7th edition OR the Modern Language Association (MLA) 7th edition. Authors should use one style consistently. Each manuscript should be accompanied by information about the author: (1) full name (family name last); (2)

institutional affiliation (3) email address(s) and phone number(s). Manuscripts should be submitted as e-mail attachments in MS format to: **ajrp@delsu.edu.ng** Contributors should kindly note that, as a rule, AJRP will not publish multiple articles by the same author in one issue.
